

Their Excellencies Speak

Greetings all,

We hope everyone had a festive Christmas and happy New Year, and that all of your preparation for Faire is running smoothly, or at least that the things that are now getting crossed off the list as unrealistic in the remaining time are not critical. We are looking forward to seeing everyone there, including many of our friends and cousins from around the Kingdom. We know that everyone in the Barony will once again make them feel welcome and we would like to thank THL Aveline and her stewarding team in advance for what we are sure will be a fantastic event.

In the last few weeks we had the last monthly heavy tournament of the year, won by Sir Ratbod, and the archery was won by Lord Ceallach. We'd like to thank all of the fighters and archers that have attended these tournaments throughout the year and hope that more will join in next year. We thank Master Brian in particular for organising the event each month and providing the winners tokens, and everyone else that has assisted with running the lists, heralding, marshalling and coming to view the fighters and archers. The monthly tournaments will continue from February, and We hope to extend them in the future to include a pot-luck lunch.

Lord Raffe also organised a second working bee at Waipara to continue work on the war field, after the concrete pad for the fortifications had been poured. We were able to stand up the forts and secure them into position, not without some serious effort on the part of Baron Bartholemew, Sir Ratbod and Lord Bjorn. The landscaping of the war field continued with many of the traps and pitfalls now adequately filled in, or at least disguised. We thank Lord Raffe for organising this and for facilitating another site tour so that some technical questions for the event could be answered. It is due in no small measure to the continued efforts of Lord Raffe and Lord Bjorn to improve relations with the site owners that we are able to make these improvements and secure our interests with the site for future years to come.

With less than two weeks until Faire, when we will once again be graced by Their Majesties presence, we encourage everyone to consider writing award recommendations. There is a handy webpage at http://royal.lochac.sca.org/recommendation/ which has the email address to send them to as well as a link to Canon Lore so that you may check to see if a particular person already has an award. We ask that if you do send a recommendation please also copy Us on the email (bandbags.lochac.sca.org) as Their Majesties will typically ask Us for comment and it is useful to have a heads-up on the recommendation beforehand. Also if you would like to discuss a recommendation with Us (perhaps to see what to recommend someone for) before making it then please feel free to contact Us. We would also like to receive recommendations for Baronial awards the details of which are available at http://sg.lochac.sca.org/barony/traditions.shtml.

We have been consulting with Our Herald with a view to changing the heraldry for the Tour d'Or and registering the current award badge as a populace badge as well as creating awards for children and others that assist with children's' activities. There will be an opportunity to comment on these proposed changes at Canterbury Faire and We would encourage everyone to do so.

Finally, if you have an inkling to run an event for Baronial Anniversary in March, please contact the Seneschal urgently. We're sure Lord Maximillian will be very pleased to hear from you and if you need assistance to prepare a bid or run the event then he would be happy to point you in the direction of people that can provide it.

Rules of the Game pt II

<u>The Corpora of The Society For Creative Anachronism, Inc</u>. August 17, 2015 Revision, Page 13 II. EVENTS

A. Society Events Defined

The term "Society event" refers to tournaments, feasts, and other activities whereby participants can display the results of their researches into the culture and technology of the period in an environment which evokes the atmosphere of the pre-17th century European Middle Ages and Renaissance. It also refers to educational activities involving either one-time classes or ongoing Society university organizations, and meetings where participants share skills or discuss the business of the group. All Society events must be sponsored by official branches of the Society, registered with the Seneschal of the sponsoring branch, publicized at least to the members of that branch, and conducted according to Society rules.

B. Requirements for Participants at Society Events

Anyone may attend Society events provided he or she wears an attempt at pre-17th century clothing, conforms to the provisions in Corpora, and complies with any other requirements (including but not limited to site fees or waivers) which may be imposed. At business meetings and informal classes, the requirement to wear pre-17th century dress may be waived. All participants are expected to behave as ladies or gentlemen.
