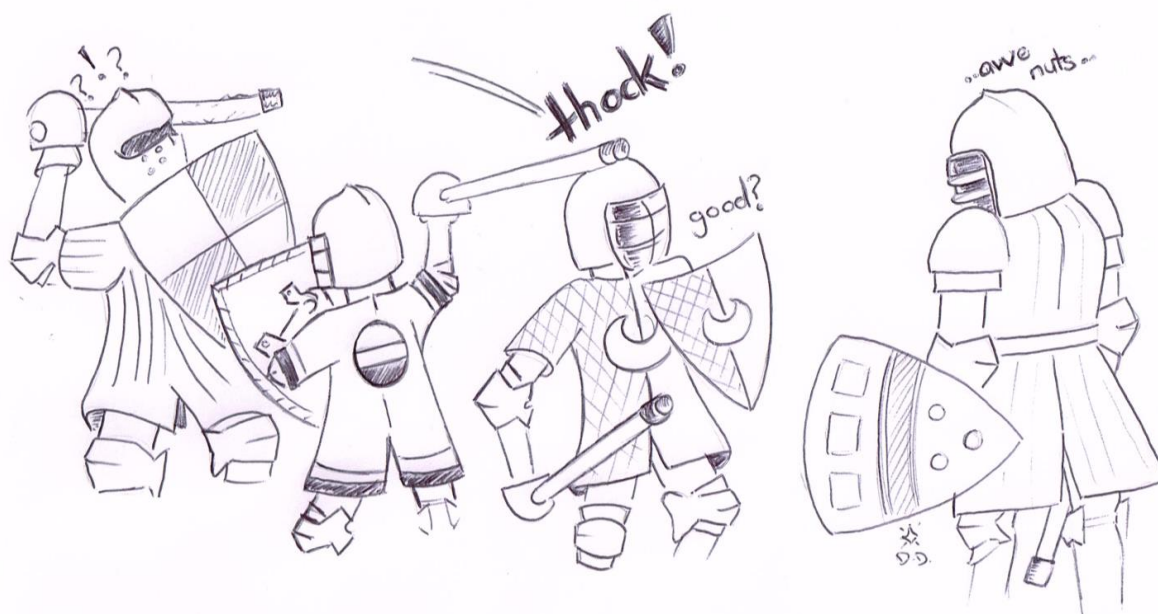

## Their Excellencies Speak



Greetings all,

The shortest day has just passed and although the darktime hours still outnumber the daylight hours it's good to know that it's just going to get better from here. We know that many of you are using these Winter months to plan and work on projects for the Heraldic Challenge, details of which were published in last month's From the Tower. Several entries have already been submitted, by Lady Amabilia Thexton and Lady Katherine Stewart, and these are visible on the Heraldic Challenge blog at <https://heraldicchallenge.blogspot.com/>. The Challenge runs to Baronial Anniversary and we are looking forward to seeing a wide variety of entries. There is also the opportunity for people to help emblinganate the Baronial Pavillions by painting mottos or motifs. Please discuss any ideas you have for this.

Although the next couple of months are a bit lacking in events (though the Monthly Tournaments continue unabated), we're pleased that a wide range are scheduled or being planned for September, October and November. We're particularly pleased that the Cross and Raven Tavern (Baroness Agnes and THL Elizabetta) have submitted a bid for July Coronation 2019. We have Our fingers and toes crossed that the Council of the Purse will grant Southron Gaard the honour of hosting this event and thank the intended-stewards for the effort and commitment to running this event.

Speaking of "intendeds", some of you may have noticed that the Baronial coffers have depleted somewhat of late, with relatively large purchases and tax bills over the last few years. Expenditure on the Baronial Army has already been curtailed

however We feel continued cutbacks in this area could hurt Our dreams of expansion. Should the downward trend continue, We may be forced to order the seneschal to implement austerity measures such as reductions in allocations of duck fat, for the frying of crunchy comestibles, or gold-leaf coated furniture. Thus we have come to the conclusion that, sadly, We are forced to raise taxes in order to ensure the long term stability of the Barony. The first of such taxes shall be levied upon those who have entered into relationships with one another without prior approval. We understand such levies are commonly known as a Bed Tax. The tax shall be 6 shillings per quarter (or part thereof) per couple engaging in unapproved hand-holding, look-sharing, sonnet-composing, or (heaven forfend) swooning and catching. Our Tax Collectors will be on the lookout for such activity and will be ready to levy this tax at a moment's notice. Such tax may be avoided however by applying for the required approval using the appropriate form (available from the Seneschal) and paying the required administration fee (4 shillings per applicant).

We hope that the need for such taxes will be short.

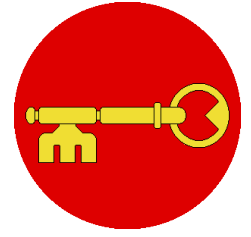

## From the Officers

### Seneschal



Greetings again all,

After a couple of month's hiatus from writing this column, I have found myself once again looking around for a relevant topic to discuss. As I've spent a portion of my evening thus far on event related tasks, I thought that this could be an excellent opportunity to talk about how events get listed on Pegasus, and the official Lochac calendar.

Those of you on the 'sgannounce' email list may have noticed from time emails with a subject line 'Event Notification for XXXXX', with event details in the email itself. These emails are generated automatically via the Lochac Events submission page (take a look at it via <http://lochac.sca.org/seneschal/database/event/new>), which also puts the event on the Lochac Gmail calendar and sends it for inclusion in Pegasus. Inclusion in Pegasus is still dependent upon publication timelines, with events that are sent after 10<sup>th</sup> of the month not always making it into the following month's publication.

This process begins after a group council has approved an event. Ideally, the event steward would be the person who fills in this form and submits it for approval by the group seneschal. This is a task that needs to be added to Southron Gaard's event steward's documentation, as I've noticed that it is a step that is often overlooked by stewards. This is unfortunate, as events must be submitted in this fashion and published in Pegasus in order for the Crown to be able to present awards, if they are attending the event. Timelines on this can be tight sometimes if Crown is attending on reasonably short notice.

Once the event has been submitted, emails are sent to the group seneschal and the event steward, containing the event details for double checking. If all looks well, the group seneschal then needs to log onto the 'Seneschal Database' and approve the event. This is the action that triggers the emails that you later see.

This is just one of the many ways that events can be promoted. I hope that those of you contemplating running events (and please do run them!) find this snippet of information useful.

The Challenge shall run until next Baronial Anniversary, when we shall hope to see a magnificent display of both personal heraldry, or that of any awards you may have received.

## Winter ailments?

It's the time of year for coughs and colds, so why not try brewing up a traditional remedy? Or consider the alternative, while you're reaching for the soothing relief of modern lozenges.

This is a selection from "The Widow's Treasure" 1588, Printed by Edward Alde, for Edward White and translated into modern-er English by your editor ☺

### To heal lips that are chapped with wind or cold.

Take New Wax, Mastic, and Frankincense, with oil of Roses, all this made in an ointment, and there with anoint the chapped lips, and they will heal presently.

### To take away the Cough or Stitch.

Take a pint or a quart of Malmsey, one handful of Aniseed, one handful of unset Hyssop: one Liquorice stick bruised, half a dish of sweet Butter, seethe all these things together till they be thick: and after spread it upon a toast of wheat bread and lay them within a linen Cloth as warm as you Maye suffer it to your Stomach. But if you will take this for a Stitch, leave out the Butter.

### For the cough.

Take three Figs and roast them, and put them in a Cup of Beer, and a little Liquorice and Aniseed beaten, then let it stand by the fire till it be warm, then take out the Figs and eat them, then drink up the drink and go to bed warm and in four nights it breaks the Cough.

### To break Flegme.

Take a quart of Muskadel, a pint of Hyssop water, three good roots of cased Ginger, and as much of Liquorice clean pared, then take two pennyworth of Sugar candie bruised, put all these in a glass, shake them together: cover your glass four and twenty hours, drink thereof Morning and Evening.

### For the Rewme and Cough of the Lunges.

Take young Elecampane roots, a pound, of Setrarch, of Maiden haire being new gathered: scrape the Elecampane roots and cut it into small slices: seethe them altogether into five pints of running water till they come to a pint and a half: then strain them and put thereto fine Sugar three quarters of a pound, then boil it till it come unto three quarters of a pint, then take two yolks of new laid Eggs and beat them: and let them boil together while you may say 'Psalm Miserere' and give hereof at night a spoonful, and another in the morning, lying on their backs an hour after they have received it: & in four days keeping them warm, it will rid the greatest Cough that is.

*Muskadel is the juice of the same grape, presumably fermented.*

*I still don't know what setrarch is. Maiden hair, as far as I can tell, is the fern we know by that name today. Elecampane is still used as a remedy for coughs.*
