Their Excellencies Speak

Excellencies, Lords, Ladies, gentles all: greetings.

Isabel Maria and I wish to do two things in this column; congratulate the team who worked to brought us BA, and write about the new groups forming to the south.

Thanks to the stewards, Ladies Elena and Agnes, for a well-run event. Thanks to the ladies who set up and decorated the hall, particularly Lady Elizabetta and Meistren Cristia. Thanks to the cook, Lord Richard, and his kitchen team, including Sir Callum and Lord Quentin. Not only has he served us as a fine Reeve (and that is only one of the offices he has held), Richard did a very fine first feast. We hope to be able to persuade him, and Sir Vitale, who did a great one last year, to do more. Cooks are a valuable and scarce resource: one of the things people will always remember about an event is the quality of the food.

Thanks to those who helped to set up beforehand - especially the Baronial pavilion - and to tidy up afterwards. This makes life so much easier for the stewards, who would have had a long day by the time the event is finishing.

We also extend congratulations here to our new champions, so that all the populace may know their names, and they may be entered into our records. (Editors Note: listed on Pg. 5.

Also; good news: Southron Gaard has two new groups forming in Timaru and Dunedin. People from them have attended Baronial Anniversary and Canterbury Faire.

We have never had a group form in Timaru before. It does not have a proposed name as yet. Lady Cseperka has stated they wish it to form organically, rather than setting a timeline for becoming an official sub-group such as a Canton or College. This places much less of a burden of daunting paperwork on those in it, particularly new members who may not be familiar with the SCA's requirements regarding reporting, having officers, and accountability at the Kingdom and Society level. Members of an official group or no, they are always welcome. We look forward to seeing them again.

Although St. Kessog is no longer active as a College, there remain in Dunedin people who have not only stacked up excellent records for service - Lady Mýrún and Lady Edith -

but continue to serve at events, and as cooks, stewards and baronial officers, rather than in a separate group.

Other people in Dunedin have expressed a wish to form a Canton, called Wildmor. They are people both new to the SCA, and some who have attended events throughout the years. The enthusiasm of the new people is very encouraging; some came to Faire very well-attired already, and one of them had already applied for a Baronial office.

A Canton would still be part of Southron Gaard, and as such can only come into being with the consent of Council and the support of the populace at large. The initiation of the process of Wildmor's becoming an incipient Canton will be discussed at the next Council meeting. If you have strong opinions about it, please bring them to the meeting, or inform the Seneschal and/or Isabel Maria and myself.

A Canton is able to request support in the form of financial support and the use of loaner gear from the parent group (where the reasoning is sound). A Canton or a would-be incipient Canton should be able to expect that people from the parent group will visit them and offer to teach. However, the majority of the work to become and remain a Canton must still be done by its own people. They must file reports and financial records; they must host events, not just for members of the parent group, but for themselves. The Seneschal and we feel that 3 to 4 a year is reasonable, given how many happen in Christchurch at present. There should also be regular practice, whether dance, fighting, or even just craft/sewing/pottering evenings.

We welcome the prospect of a new Canton in the South. We are aware it will take some time to be formalised, and what will seem like hoops to be jumped through to have official status are the sort of thing that can dampen newcomers' ardour. They are, at least, a test of commitment. This may not in itself be a bad thing. Kingdom must be persuaded that the group will survive in the long term, and that it is robust enough to not depend on one person or party. They can also protect a parent group's investment in its growth. If it eventually obtains Canton status, Wildmor will be the third group that Dunedin has had. There can be many reasons for the difficulties that have been experienced in sustaining new groups there. It is far from the support of larger and older groups with large events

that can stir and keep enthusiasm high. The population base is relatively small, and there can be a high turnover of members if they are students. This may put a large burden on those who remain to recruit, teach, and do a lot of the work of running the group and the events it needs to stay viable, which can be very draining. Also, people who wish to participate with the best of intentions may not always get on, and in a small group, it may be difficult for them to avoid each other.

We hope that the populace of Southron Gaard will encourage the people of Wildmor in their endeavours with warmth, support, the teaching of their skills and the presence of such

people as are able to make the trip down. It's closer than Australia, and whether a Canton or a simple gathering for people who share our esoteric interests, they are part of our homeland. We wish them the very best.

Seneschal's Comments

One very successful Canterbury Fair is not long past, and already there are two potential bids for the next one in the wind. In one way Canterbury Fair is a straightforward event: there is no "theme" and it has developed an established format, so it is mostly making a space for people to do their things. However, the scale of it does make the practical organisation a real challenge, and it is very encouraging that we have a good many people in our midst who are prepared to step up and take on this challenge.

Also it is helpful that past officers of our barony have set out policy to handle this situation and to give the several bidders an equitable framework. This policy is in two parts: for events in the near future (less than 6 months away), the first bid presented has priority. For events further in the future, a closing date for bids is set, and we look at what is on the table at that date. As I announced on the Announce list, the deadline for CF 2014 is the April Council meeting on 10 April.

In the process of reviewing this policy, I found that the Barony's policy document is a little bit behind the times. There are policy decisions recorded in Council minutes which have not been added to it, so some lucky person will have to read through past minutes for the last few years and find these. Like much housework, not an exciting

task, but, like much housework, it makes for a nicer place to be.

In the next year or so, we face some other housekeeping challenges in storing the Baronial equipment, and refurbishing or replacing the Baronial trailer, and restocking and improving the Baronial feast gear. However, we are very fortunate that the Barony is in a very strong position to deal with, with good financial reserves that give us more choices than we might otherwise have.

Southron Gaard Council Meeting

Wednesday 13th March 2013

PRESENT: Miriam (HE Isabel Maria), Amy (Amalie), Meredith (Taddea), Clare (Antonia), Alan (Angus), Niamh (Elena), Robyn (Agnes), Richard (Richard), Bob (Callum), Melina (Quentin), Will (Maximillian).

MEETING OPENED: 7:30pm

BUSINESS ARISING: None supplied.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria):

Correspondence with Seneschal regarding the regnum, possible Crown bids, and officer selection, changeovers, and how applicants are communicated with; with the populace regarding officer selection, changeovers, and how applicants are communicated with, and dates for upcoming Canterbury Faires; with members of the populace regarding fencing; with the Earl Marshal regarding heavy and rapier in Southron Gaard.

Attended St. Sebastian's, an event in Cluain. A good time was had by all. Chatted with the people, with the various officers of Cluain and Ildhafn, played a bit of rapier, participated in the village games, and observed a lot of very entertaining archery-related projects.

Discussion with the B&B and Seneschals, incoming and outgoing, regarding Crown bids being prepared by members of our respective populaces.

SENESCHAL (Lowrens): Correspondence with Dunedin folk about a group application to Kingdom; with potential stewards about bids for next CF, next Yule and November Crown 2014; with BA stewards about BA; with CF stewards

and Reeve about final payments for CF 2013; with Exchequer, Reeve, B&B about new Reeve appointment; with Chronicler about stepping down; with Webminister about stepping down; with Kingdom Lists about applicants for List position;

Quarterly report lodged with Kingdom Seneschal at the end of February.

REEVE (Richard): For February:

Income was **\$4,617.01**,
Outgoings were **\$23,698.72**,
Net was **\$19081.71** outgoing.

Current balances are **\$24,420.10** main account and **\$2,969.30** in the holding account.

HERALD (Lucia): No report received.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Isolde): No organised A&S activity in February. March will have sewing nights in preparation for BA.

Met at "Make Cafe" in Riccarton last week, which seemed to work well, due to the large table/room available and also availability of beverages/snacks. Shop is also open which allowed access to buy extras e.g. cotton. Seems to be a conducive environment for sewing/project night so will enquire about ongoing use past March.

Plans in progress for Viking theme for A&S activity. Awaiting further information from Mistress Cristia. Most likely to occur in the second term. Correspondence also with Emma re this, to support university group attendance as well.

Discussion with present A&S champion, Lady Elisabetta re BA and judging under way.

CHRONICLER (Mýrún): Little to report this month, at least Chronicler wise.

March FTT was released on time, there has been one application for the role of Chronicler received

to date; some correspondence with Seneschal and B&B regarding this.

Otherwise, I have been working on a bid for Yule 2013 with some of the local members, including a trip out to the proposed site. Working on the Crown bid. Some correspondence regarding CF receipts and ways to improve the coordinator role; and also some regarding the deputy exchequer role. Got AoA scrolls printed and some spares for locals to start learning C&I on.

WEBWRIGHT (Eleanora): Some small changes to Canterbury Faire pages and added next year's dates; waiting to hear it's all done and dusted before I archive this year's stuff. Added a link to story about new group in Timaru and saved a PDF of the stuff.co.nz story in case they kill it in the future. Updated calendar and page for Baronial Anniversary and ended up promoting links to A&S championship info on list.

My warrant is up in May; I have advertised the position in FITT and on the list. I'll continue this until a replacement has been found.

COMING UP: When new reeve is confirmed I'll get them set up with their new email address etc. Still working through creating officer badge images for the Regnum page; hope to complete before I step down. It would be really nice to get some good photos from BA on the gallery this year.

CHATELAINE (Quentin): Attended Sebastian's in Rotorua. A lot of fun.

Haven't bought new garb bins yet because I haven't had enough spare money which I can use. Should be able to soon. (Reminded about cash

Advances). Still waiting on some garb people haven't brought back after Faire, so I've started reminding people. Raffie delivered a heap of returned garb in some good boxes which will be reusable.

QUARTERMASTER (Angus): Quiet month. Working with BA stewards re Stuff. My warrant is well expired and I should be seeking a successor.

CONSTABLE (Bjorn): Ongoing correspondence with CF management regarding their lost property. Nothing further to report.

MARSHALL (Callum): Attended archery practices. Attended CF.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darayavaush): Practices continue, some new people coming along. A steady number of people coming along, averaging about 10 a week.

Plans for BA almost solidified, requests for assistance for CF next received and accepted.

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Elena): This last month has continued with practices on both Sunday and Tuesdays with an average of 4-5 people per session.

Have been in touch with current Baronial Champion to organise this year's Tournament. Also have heard from potential CF bid with regards to running Rapier program.

CHIRURGEON (Kotek): No report received.

EVENT REPORTS:

GOLDEN FLIGHT:

Total income \$2518, total costs \$1740, hence \$778 surplus. 47 came to the full event + 8 day trippers. Noted that the site messed up the booking, then charged a flat daily rate instead of a per capita rate, which added to the surplus. So, numbers were up and costs were down, hence larger surplus than planned.

CANTERBURY FAIRE:

(allegedly the earliest event report ever!)

Overall a \$5000 surplus, the feast ran a surplus, the attendance numbers were close to expectations.

General comments from Taddea:

- Overall - we made money and there were no serious injuries.
- Meal plan - lunch basket controversy again - need to pick one plan for lunches and stick to it (some find baskets too small).
- Varied bread was popular.
- Aussies want more fruit.
- Move \$0.50 from dinner budget to lunch.
- Foreign cheques and foreign payment are a giant pain. Exchange rate issues meant we lost money there.
- Need a clearer handover between booking steward and gate (as a lot of information was only in the booking stewards head, not on paper).
- The cash forms were good and useful (Can pass on the template). More detail on forms would be better (e.g. paying \$46 in "fees" - how many people/ days/ nights etc. is that?).
- Toilets need to be cleaned on the final Saturday as they were a bit yuck by the time we left.
- Dedicated pack down crew would be awesome.
- A day tripper costs us more than an overnighter because we pay an extra \$3.

ARMAGEDDON EXPO: They wanted too much money, and had no room inside. Did not proceed any further.

BARONIAL ANNIVERSARY: Site is confirmed and inspected. The feast has been test-run. Bookings to date are 31 confirmed for feast, 1 child, 3 day trippers. Timetable being finalised. Meeting approved purchase of mulled wine.

WIGRAM FUN DAY: Tycho advises of a community fun day for Wigram. Organisers have asked if the SCA would put on a demo on Saturday 13 April. Day is planned to run from noon to 4pm. Seneschal to canvas the level of interest; Tycho is available to take part.

YULE BID: 9-10 March. There was concern at tight margin in budget. B&B are not able to attend. Noted that Mýrún has stewarding experience, concern at possible overextension by new group.

No decision reached; Seneschal to review with Mýrún

CANTERBURY FAIRE 2014: Concern over the earlier date (18-26 January). That's what was available for 2014, and we are committed to it now. Probably too late to move it for 2015, but we could plan to bid for Twelfth Night on the first weekend. Have provisional booking for this week 2016 and 2017, but could be negotiable if we decide to move after seeing how 2014 goes.

There are two bids for 2014 in preparation. Policy is to set a closing date for bids and then review and choose. Closing date will be Council on 10 April, with final vote to choose at May Council (8 May).

Reminder to everyone that the Seneschal is the default contact with Waipara until the next stewards are chosen - route all site questions through Lowrens.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

FEAST GEAR - Given the ongoing issues we have with management of current crockery due to weight and brittleness, Antonia sees merit in researching options for lighter, less breakable gear. Noted that we have already given approval in principle for restocking the feast gear, and that we are in a fortunate position to be able to invest more in good stuff. What is missing is a specific shopping list.

Antonia will investigate and make recommendations.

EQUIPMENT STORAGE - Richard got quotes from several commercial stores.

The least expensive is Safestore: 3x2.4x2.4m space costs \$30/week (\$1560 pa), or 6x2.4x2.4m space

costs \$42 (\$2184 pa). We would need the larger size. Safestore have several sites around Christchurch. May get some discount for committing to a longer term rental.

We can afford commercial storage for a year or two, but don't want to go beyond that unless we are desperate - certainly not long term.

Probably won't have immediate availability due to lack of available units - we need to get on a waiting list. If a vacancy is not in a good part of town we can let it go.

All of this pre-supposes that we won't be storing a trailer.

THE TRAILER - No progress with having it checked. Richard will be trialling an 8'x4' hire trailer for BA to see how that works.

BARONIAL POLICY BOOK: Needs updating. The current copy is missing some known policy decision (B&B comp'ing). Seneschal to arrange this.

Putting Council minutes on SG Announce as in the past would be good.

Seneschal to arrange.
