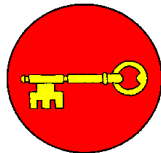

From the Seneschal



My term as Seneschal finishes in eight months. So now is a good time to be considering whether you might be interested in putting your hat into the ring. Group Seneschals are selected by the Kingdom Seneschal, on the advice of the local Baron and Baroness, and the out going Seneschal. (We don't have deputies who simply step up any longer).

The Seneschal is essentially the person who runs the mundane side of the Barony, oversees the other officers, organizes council meetings, keeps the populace informed, and makes regular reports to Kingdom. A prospective seneschal needs to be fairly organized, needs to have a decent understanding of what the various other officers do, and should be prepared to take on the role for at least one term of two years. There is a Kingdom wide Seneschals mailing list, where you can get help and advice from other group seneschals, and all of the reporting is currently being done on-line.

Since the role is a very responsible one, I'm giving you this reminder so that you have plenty of time to consider it. We should be looking for applicants some time before next Canterbury Faire, and I intend to step down at the next Baronial Anniversary. If you have any questions or want to know more about what would be involved, please contact either myself, or the Baron or Baroness, or you can talk to any group seneschal or read more on the Kingdom website.

Baronial & Pavilion Hangings Project

Unto the gifted embroiderers of Southron Gaard, does Katherine Kerr send her greetings, and a plea for you to demonstrate the skills you have and the beauty we know well you can create.

Hangings are needed to brighten up the Baronial Pavilion at Canterbury Faire where we intend it be used as a dining area and meeting place for visiting baronages and royalty who may grace our fair shores.

The Barony has available to it a large amount of Habutai silk and silk dyes, and will be making two large banners to fly at Canterbury Faire, Festival and elsewhere. These will be 2m x 2m and one will display the arms of Southron Gaard, the other the Kingdom arms.

Spare silk and dyes will be available for purchase by anyone wishing to make their own silk standard (NB: silk must be used for standard or banner production only, no garb!).

The production techniques involved are not particularly difficult. We will be using acrylic fabric paint to draw the outlines of any design; the dyes are then painted on within the lines (known as the serti technique). Testing has shown the dyes to be easy to apply and control, and relatively quick to dry. A small amount of ironing helps to set the paint/dye and keeps the colours vibrant.

I need your help - particularly, at this stage, for the exhibition.

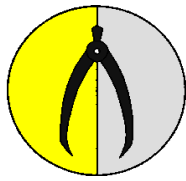
