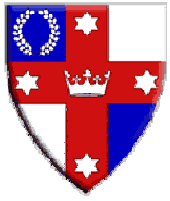

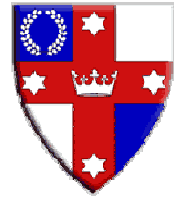

Yule Event Report

Lord Oswyn Carolus

Every winter the Barony meets the cold and dark of middle months with a feast of fine food, warmth and light. That of our present year was an august affair that did honour to the victory of the forces of the Holy mother Church over the Ottoman Empire at the sea battle of Lepanto. The hall was opulently decked out in a style to evoke the luxury of the Venetian court. A fine job was done with hangings, tapestry, heraldry and candelabra to convert a church hall into a fine spectacle.

This Yule was also the occasion for the stepping down of TEs Christopher and Clare. We wish them the very best for their travels and relocating to Ildhafn. THL Amalie was confirmed in Court as Vicar of Southron Gaard, taking over baronial duties until a new baron and baroness are chosen by Their Majesties after the September poll.

For the diversion of the assembled host, Sir Callum played the Sultan, and the present writer played Don Juan, Hapsburg emperor. Between courses, the rulers of the two opposing forces declaimed to the audience their plans for Europe, one to maintain civilisation and right, the other to lay it beneath the scimitar of the heathen. Attendance + meals + bunk: \$38 adult \$34 child

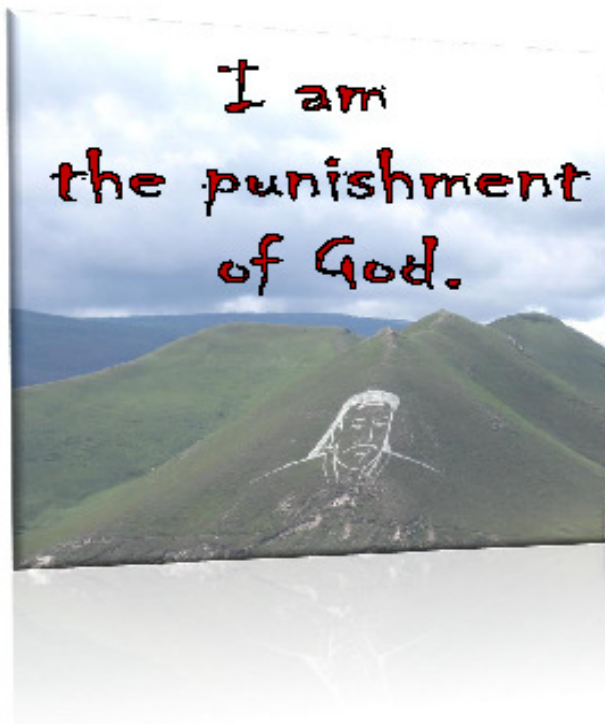

Tuesday 21th July 2011

PRESENT: Lucia (Betty), Geoffrey (Andrew), Amalie (Amy), Chunegunde (Joanna), Oswyn (Carl), Angus (Alan), Glenn, Richard (Richard)

APOLOGIES: Simone (Eleanora), Bob (Callum), Robyn (Agnes), Niamh (Elena), Elisabetta (Josie)

MEETING OPENED: 7.37 pm

JUNE MINUTES: Moved to accept June minutes – Amy, Seconded – Angus

OFFICER REPORTS:

SENESCHAL (Oswyn): Correspondence with the Vicar, with the Kingdom Seneschal, with her Grace Constanza, with Glenn regarding his event, with members of the populace across Lochac concerning assistance with and stewarding CF. Received correspondence from Lord Emilio, Lists officer and rapier marshal, stating his need to step down from office due to other commitments. Correspondence with the steward of Yule regarding a write-up of said event. Attended Arms and Militaria display.

CHATELAINE (Chunegunde): I was contacted by 1 person who has already been part of the SCA overseas, and 1 who was interested in Yule, but too late to book. An established newcomer asked about garb for Lindisfarne, gave details and advised it was not SCA. They decided not to go. I probably would have lent them the garb though. We had another garb labelling Stuff Night, and there's probably two or three boxes left to label. Thank you to THL Amalie, Mistress Isabel Maria, and Glenn for helping, and Glenn for providing venue. I organised some flyers for Raffie for the Arms and Militaria Expo, the black and white ones have been printed incorrectly, not sure what to do about this. Fotocopy Design and Print quoted at \$19.20 for 100 when I last asked in Nov 2010, and they are still open. The Expo went

well, with interest mostly from children, and one person interested who had been involved in re-enactment before. Lady Agnes and Elena attended Yule as my stand in Chatelaines, but I don't think there were any newcomers there in the end. Interesting things to bear in mind:

Some definitions came up on the Shambles as to "when you are not a newcomer". There is little consensus, but it gave good insight as to how people perceive others in the SCA. In the last couple of months, I've had 3 people ask for a phone number. None of them seemed to mind using the internet for things like newsletters and SGAnnounce, just wanted actual dialogue.

KNIGHT MARSHAL (Callum): Not much to report. Said Ziad authorized at Great Northern War.

CONSTABLE (Agnes): Attended Yule, law and order was maintained. Some lost property was returned and new additions have not yet been collected from the stewards.

CHRONICLER (Elisabetta): FT'T sent via email and loaded on to site on 3 July (after Yule). Waiting to hear back from Kingdom about replacement. Correspondence with B&B, Seneschal about columns.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Amalie): Had second stuff night of sewing labels on garb; apparently we are more than halfway through. Seamsters' was at Mathilda and Emilio's, venue for this month undecided. Currently putting together Mouse Guard token kits to try and get the populace to help get Kingdom supplies to a healthy level.

VICAR (Amalie): Correspondence with Gabriel and Constanza regarding appointment, responsibilities of vicarage, baronial polling process. Have not heard from Cornelius/Elizabeth re whether I will be managing this- will follow up.

Joined baronages mailing list. Correspondence with Maximilian and Giles re step-up court. Stepped up at Yule. Quiet since.

WEBWRIGHT (Eleanora): It's been a pretty quiet month online. Over the last month I have undertaken the following with regards the Southron Gaard website:

- Bugged our lady Chatelaine about the revised content of the newcomer's page at <http://sg.lochac.sca.org/newcomers.shtml>

Promised for this weekend.

- Lord Richard d'Allier's problems with viewing the Google calendar seemed to resolve themselves.

- Made a start of re-formatting the site documentation to make it a bit easier to get around.

- Other than that mostly dispatching spam as it comes into the mailbox.

- Could all the officers to send me a photo and persona blurb for the populace page?

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Geoffrey): Weather has been unusually mild, practices have continued with 6 or 7 people most weekends. Armour workshops have been happening as well, with several people starting on making bits of armour.

REEVE (Richard): Kingdom and SCANZ levies include CF2011, BA2011, and St Judes 2011. CF ones had been confirmed with Raffe in April, but only included now that April 1/4ly report has been completed. St Jude's ones were waiting on confirmation from Angus, but just gone ahead with the last figures we had now. Also see below

QUARTERMASTER (Angus): Yule: transported stuff to and from site. Trailer registered, to be reimbursed when receipts and chequebook are in the same place. Would like volunteers to take a half dozen each to clean. Antonia pointed out table cloths should be cleaned on site at CF. Oven at Yule – one worked, one didn't – need to be checked out/certified by an electrician, particularly as they may void our insurance cover.

REPORT FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

HERALD (Maximillian): Current outstanding work: 1 Submission. (Did not realise I had to action it further until received notice from

Benedict. Finishing this off is pending on purchases.) Things done since last meeting: Heralded Yule. I will be billing the barony for a bunch of markers so I can do submission work, as soon as I figure out what brand to buy from where. (I suspect Crayola has changed its range.)

EVENT REPORTS:

YULE ARROW (Ellen): – a competition be held at next archery practice – garbed, no site fee.

GOLDEN FLIGHT II (Geoffrey): new site found: Birch Hill Lodge. Omaka site short of buildings and water, A bit more expensive than Omaka, but looks to be a good site – steward to look at site over the weekend. Richard – question – if budget for GF II too close to a breakeven only, and wants to budget a small profit just in case. Amalie, Antonia, Robyn has volunteer to assist with lunch/dinners.

GAMES EVENING (Glen, 20 Aug 2011): advertised in FTT and on the list. Security and bond fee Glenn said he was initially told did not need to be paid are unavoidable, but not unprecedented. Glenn would like to talk to the Quartermaster about banners, and the Vicar about a Court, and giving out prizes.

FIMBULWINTER (Myrun): Myrun has provided a budget, so Council ok with St. Kessog's being sent the bond for the scout hall as requested last council.

CANTERBURY FAIRE: (Raffe and Rotte): bid by Raffe (written budgets provided). Budget to be reviewed by FC – breakfast and ball supper, soup kitchen, and tea and coffee to be listed as items separate from the meal plan budget, and budgeted for separately. Also, budget for meal plan – in current bid, there is an apparent difference between food cost and income budgeted for it. Queries made as to why meal plan seems budgeted to be loss-making. Amy and Richard proposed budget to be looked over by the Financial Committee at a different

time. Further discussion on fixed fees vs. a per person charge.

OTHER BUSINESS:

PHONE NUMBERS: having Chatelaine and Seneschal's phone numbers on the regnum would be a good thing. Geoffrey stated that a Skype number could be used, as they could be re-directed as offices change. Oswyn and Chunegund happy to have their home numbers posted.

Antonia – Skype calls cost \$6 US a month. 2talk service essentially free (028 number) - you pay as you go for calls. Geographically-located number – about \$11.50 a month?

LONER ARMOUR: says photos of loaner armour soon to be available. Says there three full sets, plus bits.

ONLINE BANKING: report back on online banking: \$10 a month. Discussion that this may not be used much in winter, but during busy months lading up to big events, may be very busy. Will press for reduced fee for non-profit group – supports two-signatory system. Angus moved to make application for online banking, Raffie seconded.

FINANCIAL COMMITTEE: Richard moved to accept Amy as member of the Financial committee to replace Clare.

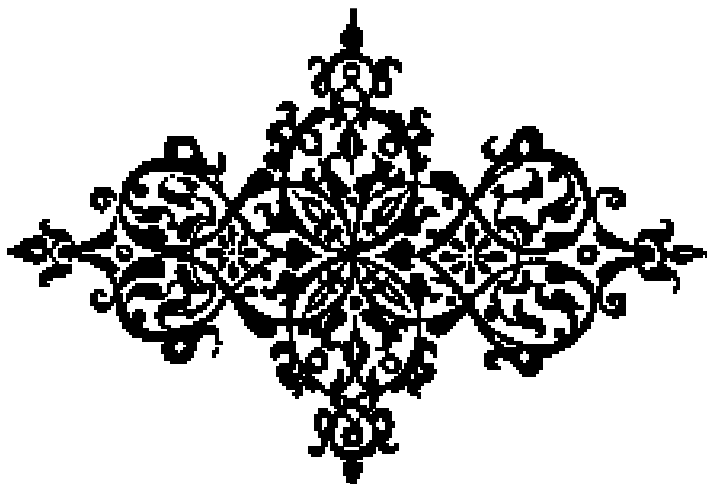
