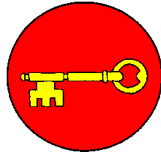

Make Yourself Known

With Canterbury Faire just around the corner and many new faces expected to attend, I'd like to say a word or two about etiquette when it comes to introductions.

SCA ranks and titles can be a bit intimidating, as can new faces and visiting dignitaries, however they need not be.

Please don't use people's mundane names if you can avoid it. You can refer to anyone, even those you don't yet know, as M'lord or M'lady without insult.

It is always appropriate to introduce yourself to people you have not met, no matter what their rank or title. If you are shy you can get someone that has met both of you to make the introductions.

Introduce people you have met to others that you know. If you are making an introduction remember that "-Higher ranked person's name-, may I introduce -lower ranked persons name-" is correct etiquette. If you're not sure whether they have met "so-and-so, have you met thingy-me-bob" is appropriate.

When talking in a mixed group where not everyone knows everyone else, use the persona names and correct titles of those you do know, so that other people can pick up on them.

The King and Queen will be present at Canterbury Faire. (For those who don't know, they are the ones with the crowns on) It is appropriate to treat them with a little more formality than most, and to bow or curtsy as they pass. (We do the same to the empty thrones when passing those) However the Royals are also real people, who love to meet the members of Their populace, so please feel free to introduce yourselves and others to them, if they are not occupied..

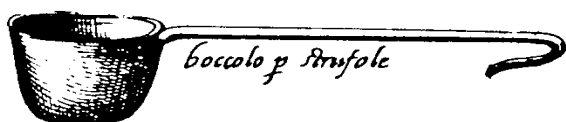

CANTERBURY FAIRE

Had between 85 and 90 bookings when Very Early Bird bookings closed on 1 December. The \$55 Early Bird rate will be available until 15 January.

Stefano d'Urbino is confirmed as feast cook. Feast is already 2/3 full, so anyone wanting to go to the feast needs to book ASAP. I still have some vacancies to fill, notably day stewards and meal plan dinner cooks.

BARONIAL ANNIVERSARY

Duncan will cook the Feast- Spanish themed circa 1500

Belle will be Day Steward Simone will be Evening and Feast Steward

Belle found a venue- St Peters Church Hall at Church Corner.

Good private grounds for fighting

Date will be 25 March

Hall and land will cost \$250 with a \$200 bond. Estimate about \$15 for day per person

MUSTERS- It would be good to restart these in February

WINTER ESCAPE EVENT

DECISION: August would be a better time than June as we would have more chance of Snow.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Officer replacement and changeover procedures. We need to get dates for stepping down.

SCANZ

We need another SCANZ rep. It needs to be investigated whether one can be an officer and the rep at the same time. We do still have Vitale, so do have some representation.

Canterbury Faire Storage

Sheds are \$500-700 apiece, which is much cheaper than the container.

Ross suggested a Truck Canopy, there is one in the area, which could easily be moved on site. At \$300-350 this is definitely the cheapest option, but it may need a little work. It is midway in the size range, and would be cheapest to move if we had to. Only heard about this today, so have some time to decide.

We will also need to pay rent for the space. \$1/day was suggested, we want to propose another working bee.

Decision: Subject to inspection, this is the best option.

EEPPSS-

Was on field at the siege event. Was field tested by a marshal and approved.

Was strength tested by bouncing the court physician. Very transportable. All round success.

It would also be easy to expand at a later date, to adapt it for use in a wider range of battle scenarios.

Location of First Aid Kit

Don't know when it was last seen or what has happened to it. The stock inside has probably expired now, and would need to be replaced.

If we can't find it, we can get another, possibly from NZ safety or St John, in a more portable box.

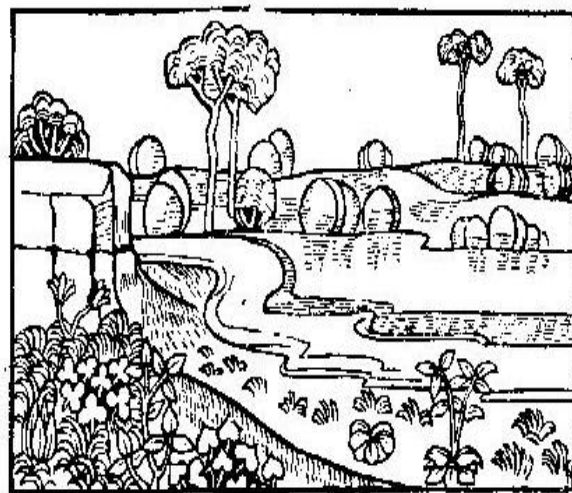
