Seneschal's Comments

Greetings all,

Firstly a quick status report on things, since last month was my first quarterly report to Kingdom and I thought you should all get the highlights. Our membership continues to rise, and as of last month we had 86 paid SCANZ members in the Barony, up 6 from the previous quarter. This is excellent and shows that many people actively support, identify with and are involved with Southron Gaard and the numbers continue to rise. Thank you to everyone that takes out a membership – you support not just the local group but the whole society worldwide.

On the topic of increasing activity, I would like to commend the fighters (and spectators) for making Sunday practices a weekly highlight. Generally speaking, we are getting 10-12 fighters along each week and a few spectators or people wanting to try it out. This is fantastic and really makes coming to practice worthwhile. If you've been struggling to find motivation to come along, I encourage you to get out of bed and give it a go.

The Barony's funds also remain healthy with approximately \$28500 in the bank. As always, we continue to seek ideas and projects from people that will help us use these funds to better our game. While it's prudent to maintain sufficient

funds to weather an unprofitable Canterbury Faire (heaven forefend!) there are many ways we can invest funds in the group.

Our event schedule for the next couple of months is great, with Yule just past and Collegium and Fimbulwinter all lining up. It was also pleasing to have two bids for Golden Flight this year even though it's sad to have to say no to one of them. Congratulations to Lady Mýrún and Lord Bjorn on their successful bid for a Japanese-themed event and my thanks to Lady Eva and her household for their bid for a Robin Hood-themed event. I have also had an expression of interest for a smaller event around October/November to kick the tourney season off. Having these events to look forward to is a big win.

Council is always pleased to receive bids for any type of event, and the Baronial officers are here to support stewards to make the event successful. Please don't be shy in coming forward even if you just have an idea for an event and would like some help to run it.

One thing we don't have yet though is a bid for Canterbury Faire 2015. Usually by this time each year we have a steward, and planning is already underway. Since there is obviously no question that Canterbury Faire will happen, the organisation of the event falls to me unless someone steps forward in the next couple of weeks. Related to this, at the June Council meeting I raised the idea of forming a Canterbury Faire steering committee which would be a small group of (probably 3) people that would assist each year's steward by providing guidance and information, and could act as a sounding board should the steward need to discuss ideas or problems. The committee would not in any way diminish the steward's role of shaping the event, but would help to ensure that the knowledge gained from previous Faïres

continues to be utilised. There are also potentially long-term projects that may require co-ordination over several years to complete, that the committee members would help progress.

I will be speaking to several people over the next few weeks to see if they are willing to serve the Barony in this way. My hope is that the committee will be formed from people familiar with running large events and with a variety of interests so that we get a good coverage of all of the issues related to running a successful Canterbury Faire each and every year.

Now to another win – June's Council meeting was the first which was also successfully held online. We've found a stable internet connection at the library (thanks to Baroness Eleanora) and Lady Mýrún was able to join us from Dunedin for the entirety of the meeting. We will therefore continue with this at all Council meetings and hope that more people will be able to join in.

Finally, in the coming months we'll be working on establishing a Southron Gaard presence on Facebook. At the June Council meeting several people expressed strong support for this, however there was also strong concern based on previous experiences of such sites for other SCA groups being used to post hurtful comments. We will therefore trial setting up a page, so that news can be posted and commented on.

ANZAC Day Fighter Training

Over the Anzac Day long weekend of 2014, the forming group of Wildmoor, located in Dunedin, was privileged with a visit from three of Southron Gaard's experienced heavy fighters, Sir Callum McLeod, Sir Phillipe de Tournay and The Honoured Lord Richard d'Allier. Along with these august presences came a substantial quantity of loaner armour, some intended to remain with the fledgling fighters.



Despite their long journey, initial training was given on the pell on the Friday to a good sized group of 5 locals, with Sir Phillipe acting as primary demonstrator and Richard and Sir Callum coaching individuals as they worked.

Saturday's training took place in the Wakari School Hall (for the weather in Dunedin is ever uncertain), where several of the local group armoured up and trained one-on-one with the Christchurch fighters. Additionally there was a pell available outside for further instruction, much to the amusement of some local schoolchildren and their parents who watched and asked questions from time to time.

That evening, there was an informal pot-luck dinner held at Mýrúns abode, where the northerners and Wildmoor fighters were joined by other, gentler members of the local group and a few new members to eat, talk, and enjoy good company.

Sunday saw the departure of the worthies to the Baronial Capitol, and a subsequent flurry of pell-making amongst the members of Wildmoor. It is to be hoped that a proud troop of heavy fighters from the South will soon authorise and bring honour to the Barony.

MEETING OPENED: 7:30pm

PREVIOUS MINUTES: Passed unanimously.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): Oswyn attended Lindisfarne & Fighters' Practice, Correspondence with SG Seneschal re officer vacancies, with SG Webwright re updating SG page (champions etc), with SG Reeve re event finances, with SG Chronicler re column and latest FTT, with SG event stewards (Yule, Collegium, Fimbulwinter) re attendance & classes on offer etc, with SG populace (via list) due to postponed video afternoon. Projects: Had another look for fabric for banner(s) - still out of luck. AM NOT GIVING UP but may raid personal stash and/or modify plans significantly.

SENECHAL (Richard): Correspondence with Reeve, Deputy Exchequer and SCANZ Treasurer re SG financial report. Completed now. Quarterly report to Kingdom. Update on AS50 Tapestry event from Katherine Kerr.

REEVE (Mahasti): \$198 income for the month with no outgoings. Current balances \$27426 in the main account and \$3017.30 in other account. There have been various sundry consulting with Ginevra and Richard. To both I owe my sanity, chocolate and wine. Also consulting with SCANZ treasurer and Deputy Exchequer resulting in suggestions to change the reporting Excel spreadsheet. Has been ill.

HERALD (Lucia): Sent Quarterly report. Correspondence with webwright, B&B re award page.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Currently Vacant): No report.

CHRONICLER (Eva): Got FTT out, however due to not having everyone's permission couldn't get Mýrún's article out but will do so next month. Fixed up FTT docs page on website. May do more to it in the next few weeks. Otherwise quiet.

WEBWRIGHT (Ginevra): This month I have been keeping mailing lists spam free, checking pointing on email addresses, and creating email addresses for Wildmoor after conversation with Seneschal and SCANZ webhost. Created info@ contact@ enquiries@ addresses for relevant officers after correspondence with SCANZ webhost, Ildhafn Webwright, and Ildhafn Seneschal, because it was their idea. Kept the calendar updated. Correspondence with stewards over webpage creation for Collegium and Fimbulwinter Creating a webpage for Richard's Collegium. Correspondence with Seneschal, Masonry team and others re Drupal support. Correspondence with Seneschal, Herald and Baron re awards section on website, and various others on other sections.

CHATELAINE (Philippe): No report received.

QUARTERMASTER (Raffe): No report, however bins were purchased (12 stackable cubes and some stackable fish bins for larger items). Feast gear needs to be washed before use if stored in open boxes.

CONSTABLE (Bjorn): Correspondence with Lady Mýrún and Seneschal re Golden Flight 2014 bid. Retrieved the CF lost property which is ready to be itemised.

MARSHALL (Elena): No report.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darayavaush): Practice sporadic in the last month due to the

weather and lack of attendance. Still waiting to hear back from kingdom about a new captain. Hoping to hand over the reins at Yule. Otherwise all quiet on the western front.

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Elena): No report received.

CHIRURGEON (Kotek): No report received.

EVENT REPORTS:

Past Events:

12th Night (Isabel Maria): Final event and financial report received. There were problems with heavy wind and rain (damaged tents, paperwork) before settling down. Couldn't get any information from Wiamakariri District Council about how to pay them for the use of the park. The heraldic display competition encouraged some fabulous displays from the participants. The banks at the site are big enough to set tents up on top which gave a lovely feel around the "sunken" tourney field. Lavatories can be found over the river and to the left but better facilities are at the Information Centre opposite New World. Income \$124, Costs \$31, total profit \$93. Since the income for the event has been lost (believed to be handed over at a previous council but could not be confirmed) Isabel Maria has paid in the income in full.

Upcoming Events:

Yule (Amalie): The event is imminent now. 47 bookings and 9 spaces left. Will speak to Raffé about gear and Mahasti about money.

Collegium (Richard): Confirmed move to 19th/20th July. Contacting people to teach classes. Good progress on the schedule. Will have a projector available.

Wildmoor Fimbulwinter (Gheleyn): No report. Event ads have gone out though.

Golden Flight: Two bids reviewed. Mýrún and Bjorn presented a Japanese-themed event. Adjustments suggested to the budget to remove

the meal plan comp for the B&B (they get comped for the site fee and feast but not the meal plan). Total cost of this bid per adult \$67. Eva and Darayavaush presented a Robin-Hood themed event. Total cost \$70 per adult. Both events at Rimu park and included a variety of tourneys and activities. Discussion ensued and the majority vote was in favour of Mýrún and Bjorn.

Canterbury Faire: No bid yet. Idea presented by Richard to form a steering committee responsible for ensuring knowledge is retained and passed on to each steward, but not responsible for actual event management. Also able to progress long term (multi-year) projects related to the event. Ideally 3 ex-CF stewards with a range of interests. Concerns raised about the committee controlling the event and the perception that it's now in charge and excluding the steward from decisions. Also concerns about the seneschal inviting selected people on to the committee. Seneschal responded that committee would report to council and be transparent. There are lots of things that people can get the wrong perception about. Can't do much about perceptions, only actions.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Terminology: Isabel Maria raised concerns about the use of "counter bid" which is a very adversarial term with concerning implications, as compared to "alternate bid" or just "bid".

Leather: Richard raised question as to whether people feel it's worthwhile for SG to purchase some of the leather available via Lord Luan at the moment. No support. Many individuals already purchasing directly.
