Bartholomew.

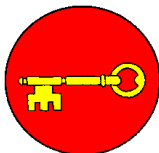
I am happy to inform you that

From the Seneschal



Traditionally, we in the SCA have had a policy of leaving a site cleaner than we found it, but in recent times and particularly at the Canterbury Faire just passed, we've been letting that tradition slip. For the first time in a very long time the site wardens were NOT happy with the way we'd left the place, and that was even after the event stewards and the last few off site ran around like mad things trying to tidy up.

Every event requires a clean up afterwards and stewards, who are almost always worn to a frazzle by the end of an event, need all the help they can get. I remember that events used to end with large clean up parties which were, in many cases, the highlight of the event. Mopping floors, washing dishes, singing and laughing together made for a sense of camaraderie, of having created something or made a little magic. You felt like you were part of the event and part of the group rather than just a spectator or a paying customer.

I'd like to encourage a return to this tradition and a renewal of the proud boast that "We are the SCA and we leave a site cleaner than we found it!" Please, add a few minutes to your plan for the evening to help tidy up, rather than leaving as soon as the entertainment has finished. If you can't then clean something or do a few dishes before you leave. Many hands make light work, and having everyone do just a little mean no one has to do a lot.

Site owners LOVE people who show the sort of care and consideration that a really good clean up shows, and we always want to be welcome back at the sites we use. Please pitch in to make sure this is always the case.

In the Spanish custom of honouring Knights for the wounds sustained in battle, the tournament to select our champion be a "Tournament of the Wounds". Single elimination bouts will be scored negatively (points taken off your starting total) for any wounds and kills received. Fighters reduced to zero points will be eliminated, until there is only one survivor. Fighting will be fast and furious, with tactical thinking a definite advantage.

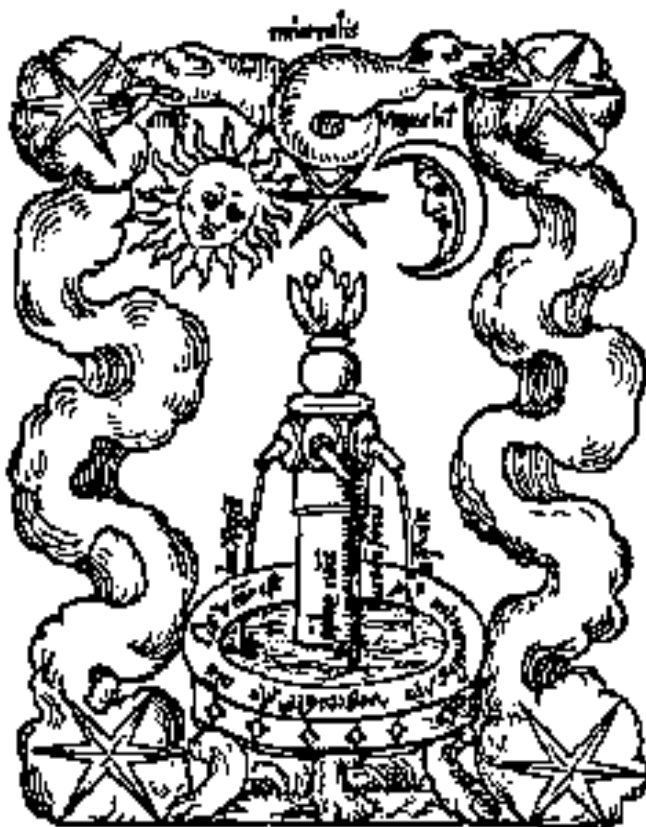

MEETING OPENED: 7.38 LAST MEETINGS MINUTES: Accepted

OFFICER REPORTS:

SENESCHAL: Did inventory of Baronial stuff held by the Quarter Master –threw out some old comestibles, repacked everything else. The Baronial platters need replacing. The Baronial oven mitts need replacing. Quarter master is to get list typed up and on line soon. My suggestion is we set a policy of not accumulating random stuff. We need to balance the usefulness of owning equipment with the hassles of storage and of owning more stuff than we can practically keep track of. Let's curb our pack rat tendencies when it comes to Baronial gear.

Did inventory of Baronial hire garb at last Medieval stuff night. Threw out several old items in bad condition. Only a couple of items need alteration or repairs. A lot of the children's clothing we once owned appears to be missing. More children's grab was made and/or donated in the lead up to CF. We are in need of more under tunics and chemises. (Eleanora offered to make some if the Barony will supply fabric) Most of the hire garb got booked for Canterbury Faire, but not all of it was used in the end. Still waiting the return of many items.

Assisted Sam West with application for Chirurgeon's warrant. Supervised his first aiding at CF in my capacity as Seneschal. Very happy with his performance and have reported same to Kingdom Chirurgeon who awaits confirmation of Sam's membership and first aid credentials.

Received correspondence from Sasha saying that she has joined the order of the Boar and will not have time to put into becoming an SCA equestrian marshal at this time, but she still leans the project her support and is happy to help out anyone else who might be interested in becoming an equestrian marshal.

Received one formal application for the post of Reeve, closing date for applications is June 1st, step up at Yule. Have received no applications for the position of Seneschal. Closing date is March 1st.

Much communication with Natalia Yates regarding the setting up of the college at Otago. They are looking at using the name the College of St Kessog, and are proceeding with Otago student's Union affiliation, selection of officers and SCA paperwork. They will be having a "first meeting" March 4th and a number of us have volunteered to go down to Dunedin to help out. They request further visits throughout the year and will be posting details to the mailing list.

Received thanks from the President of the UCMRS for Canterbury Faire and returned our thanks for their attendance. Royals remarked that good will and co-operation between SCA and Steel weapons groups was a rare thing on the larger island and they congratulated us for having such good neighbourly relations.

Attended a tin hats and seneschals dinner at Canterbury Faire where much useful conversation was held, and suggestions given to The Crown and the Kingdom Seneschal regarding the smoother running of the bureaucratic side of the Kingdom.

WEBWRIGHT: Usual updates plus CF stuff, started liaison and design work on a sub-site for the proposed College of St Kessog in Otago

Some new things need to be purchased, most urgently oven pads. We also suggest new, lighter bowls and platters, a meat thermometer, a spice grinder. We should also consider some replacement plastic containers, as some are showing a lot of wear.

Arranged for pickup of majority of items for CF. Transported listfield, candles, portable holes. Am awaiting a big Shipment back.

ACTION: Belle to remind Schmoo about promised first aid kit

ACTION: Marshall Stuff to Richard after CF Stuff returns

B&B: Went to CF, didn't die of exhaustion. Very very good feedback concerning the event from everyone we spoke to, from Their Majesties down.

Attended singing, seamsters, hosted more banner painting, with more yet to happen (silk still available...) Managed to get poles and holes sorted for the many CF banners, seemed to be well received. MANY thanks to Lord Dieter for making four new/large portable holes for the banners.

Baronial Anniversary; All on target, tickets selling. We have MUCH entertainment, enough to run late. We have a wet weather plan. Duncan wants \$400 for food.

Yule: There was to be a presentation bid from Gavin- next month.

Bal d'Argent – awaiting results of the bid process.

Mid-winter Coronation – looking into a bid for 2007, bid options still being explored.

Financial Committee report on platter replacement. WE are getting 24 platters from a supplier in India- this will act as a quality check for the rest of the new stuff that we are considering.

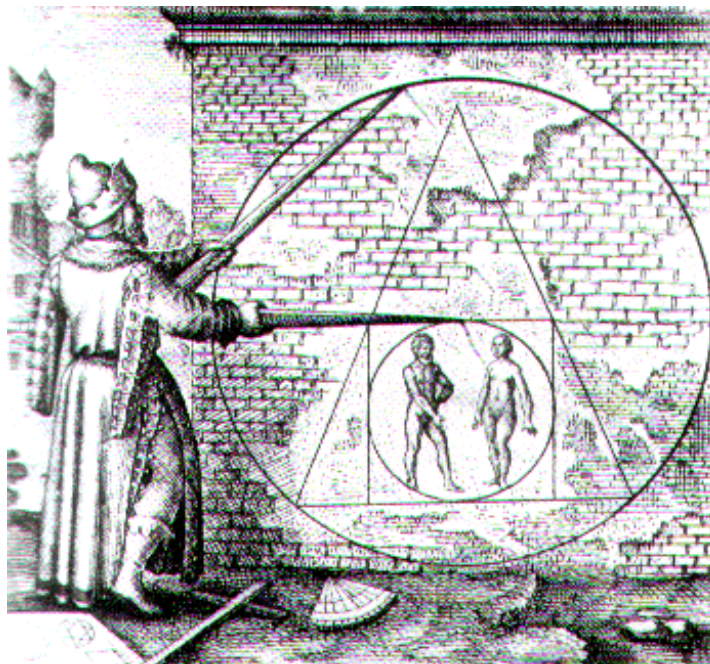
Financial committee had okayed \$25 for purchase of material for Baronial fly-covers and for re-subscription to T.I & C.A. Vicki was re- subscribing us.
