We wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who braved the wilds of North Canterbury to attend Baronial Anniversary at the fabulous Cust Community Centre, with additional thanks to those who provided transportation for others and/or stayed behind to help with the clean up.

The stewarding team (Signora Elisabetta et al) did well in the face of inclement weather, while the cooking crew (Dama Antonia, Mistress Taddea and Lady Sybilla) did themselves proud in this new and untried venue. (We understand that others also helped in the kitchen, thanks to them also). Attendees were amused throughout the day with a variety of entertaining tournaments run by the outgoing Baronial Champions, which included such memorable incidents as Quentin's unbreaking stick (supplied by Lord Raffie), and the beautiful Archery/Crossbow targets created by Lord Ronan. ## Seneschal's Comments

I must add my thanks to others to Lady Elisabetta and her team who made the Baronial Anniversary happen last month.

The venue in Cust, though semi-rural, was nevertheless quite roomy and well appointed, with child-friendly surrounds, and not expensive or onerous to hire. The stewards report that there are other similar venues in the districts surrounding Christchurch, which probably deserve some attention, given the limited range of venues in the city itself at the moment.

However, their outlying nature immediately raises a question of how to reduce or avoid any problems of transport that this might pose for some people. I would be interested to know how many people might have wished to go but were put off by some aspect of travel to the site.

At time of writing, I don't have details of the BA finances, but I do know that it covered its costs with a comfortable margin. This is the desirable state of affairs for our events in the long run, which means that we can cope with an occasional event not doing very well, for whatever reason, without breaking anything.

Through the efforts of our event stewards to meet this expectation over time, our Barony has a comfortable bank balance of about \$15,000, once all our current bills are paid. From history, we know that there is a minimum reserve needed to

avoid cash shortage problems in preparation for Canterbury Fair, and we are comfortably over that.

Therefore, I think that it is worth asking and discussing: if we chose to apply some of the spare reserve to enhancing the Barony, what might we usefully spend it on? Is there equipment or other kit that we might invest in, that would increase the splendour and pageantry of our events? Or increase the interest of the regular activities or make these easier to run?

We are not under any pressure to follow this course, nor to assign all of our free reserve to it. If there are no glowing, white-hot ideas to be had just at the moment, or we do not sufficiently agree on the best ideas, then we can wait, in the expectation that such ideas will likely arise in the future.

Please give some thought to this, and please share these thoughts in the public discussion I hope to spark off in the near future.

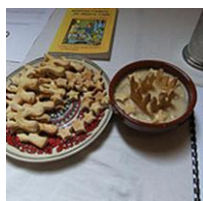
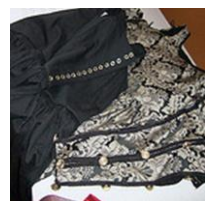

# Southron Gaard Council Meeting

Tuesday 24th April 2012

**MEETING OPENED:** 19:33pm

**MARCH MINUTES:** Minutes of previous meeting accepted (Moved: Calach, Seconded Angus).

## **OFFICER REPORTS:**

**B&B** (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): Correspondence with Baronial Anniversary stewards and Champions.

Correspondence with Kingdom Rapier Marshal, Kingdom Chirurgeon and with Seneschal regarding new officer appointments.

**SENESCHAL** (Lowrens): Correspondence with Kingdom Earl Marshal regarding appointment of Captain of Archers; with Kingdom Hospitaller regarding appointment of Chatelaine; Kingdom Chirurgeon regarding appointment of Chirurgeon.

Correspondence with Reeve regarding bringing the Baronial account signatories up to date.

Correspondence with Elisabetta regarding preparations for Baronial Anniversary, and with Elena and Emilio about plans for Crescent Fence to be held in SG later in 2012 (probably October), in response to an enquiry from Darton.

**REEVE** (Richard): Presented Domesday report.

**HERALD** (Maximilian): No report received.

## **ARTS AND SCIENCES**

(Amalie): Correspondence with Lowrens and Amalie regarding office handover. Hosted a Seamsters' night.

**CHRONICLER** (Mýrún): The April edition of FTT was published on time. The only correspondence this month was with Baroness Eleanora who advised that her photos of BA may be used in the May edition of FTT.

Also attended Baronial Anniversary.

**WEBWRIGHT** (Eleanora): First my apologies for missing last month's report.

Recently I completed my audit of the pages at the root of the site and have uploaded redirect pages for those that have moved. Hopefully, these will no longer show up in search-engine results, or if they do, will no longer present old information. Other than that there have been a couple of officer transitions and BA resulted in a new batch of champions and awardees to add, many of which have been done.

The baronial traditions page <http://sg.lochac.sca.org/barony/traditions.shtml> has become very large, and I have decided to create a new separate page for the champions <http://sg.lochac.sca.org/barony/champions.shtml> which I am still working on, so it isn't linked up yet. I was given some updated information about holders of relics and baronial awardees, but I believe that this page is still out of date, and would appreciate any information that the officers of the group might be able to add.

The baronial exchequer has just provided us with several new documents, which I hope to post in the next couple of days.

**CHATELAINE** (Quentin): Stepped up at BA. Fought in the Heavy Combat and Archery tournaments.

Wishes to propose that hire garb be moved from the Showbiz lockup to her flat.

**CONSTABLE** (Agnes): Have not yet managed to wrangle lost property from CF. Announced intention to step down when a replacement can be found.

Attended Baronial Anniversary. There were no serious injuries or incidents. Practices are occurring.

**CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS** (Jajiradai): Accidentally held an arrow-repair workshop. Repaired baronial loaner arrows with Lord Calach's help.

Attended BA, had no official work to do. Stepped down as Captain, and Lord Darayavaush stepped up. Have agreed to carry on as Deputy and transport gear to practices when he is unavailable. Started organising moving Baronial archery gear to his place.

**CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS** (Darayavaush): Stepped up at BA. No practice the next day. Had a practice last Sunday - potentially lethal incident where an archer stepped up to the line and fired while the Marshal was on the range setting up targets. Reports have been sent to the Baronial and Kingdom marshals.

For consideration - pulling of the archer's marshalling card if it is current - other ramifications? Discussion of stronger safety measures, e.g. no one shoots until there is a line marshal on the line, and the line is not laid down until all of the targets are set up; also accounting for the whereabouts of everyone at the practice before any shooting takes place.

**CAPTAIN OF RAPIER** (Elena): Been rather busy with wedding and all recently, however, ran the BA rapier champion tournament. No injuries or problems. A field of four, Sir Callum, Lords Hjames and Timothy, and Baron Oswyn competed. Elena herself was unable to enter at the last moment due to an equipment malfunction.

Practices resumed the next weekend – only two people showed up. Looking at a new venue, St Albans end of Barbadoes St? Will pass details onto other fighters and perhaps start using in the next few weeks.

**QUARTERMASTER** (Angus): Baronial Anniversary happened. Gear made it to site.

Things to discuss: Flagpoles; some bins used for transporting heavy items need replacing. Discussion whether to make wooden ones or simply purchase more plastic ones.

Purchase sack barrow? Angus to price.

Raffe: Do we need to purchase more crockery?  
Angus: This has already been approved, and the cooks are looking into it as an ongoing exercise.

### EVENT REPORTS:

**CANTERBURY FAIRE** (Raffe & Rat): Final summary from Raffe and Sir Rat. The event recorded the highest attendance yet.

Problems: Raeward Fresh have unsold their wholesale business, the account that had been set up had not been used since last CF (2011), was therefore not considered active, and the details were not retained. To consider: Do we need to set up a Baronial account with them?

Childcare Policy: SCANZ to write a 'Child supervision at events' policy. There need to be practical guidelines at events for surgeons and those supervising children's activities, regarding what is and is not appropriate and necessary for the protection of all parties.

Related Issue: Age limit on the children's sleepover in the hay-bale fort? Council agrees 10 – 13 years, depending on supervisor's discretion?

The storage container at CF site is leaking. Proposed working bee 6<sup>th</sup> May to repair and restock.

Toilets - Raffe informed Council that the CF site people can clean the toilets for \$2 a head. Council consensus was that this was a good idea, and it will be recommended to the next CF stewards.

Discussion: Should the Barony buy a 20'x20' container? Raffe: Estimated price \$2000. Will make further inquiries. Not just for safe storage for Baronial / Mong / CF items, but also for Australian equipment to save them having to bring so much over with them. The Festival stewards allow Southron Gaard to store items more or less for free, so we should return the courtesy. It may also help to encourage Australians to attend if the logistics are simpler.

Raffe: Do we want a survey about CF?

Response: Mýrún has already volunteered to do one – just waiting on the questions to put in it.

Discussion: Raffe asked if people were comfortable with the amount of profit made from CF. Consensus was that the surplus was a good thing - higher than initial cautious estimates - and that it could be used in the future to make purchases if booking money for an event came in late.

Richard expressed concern with the level of profit (also Angus and Isobel Maria) if it were to continue at that level. Richard - we don't want to put the event out of reach of our less-affluent members, or those with families.

**(Oswyn post-meeting:** We must remember that the event should be accessible to our locals, whose average income may be less than that of Australians who can fly out here for a holiday. CF

is great for showcasing Southron Gaard to Australians, but we should also ensure that it remains fun for us).

Raffe - Have reduced/concession prices for families and perhaps some other cases? Council seemed in agreement with this idea.

On a related note - comments have come back about the excess of sausages served on the meal plan, and on their quality. While they may have helped the event's profit, encourage next year's stewards to a) get nicer ones, and/or b) use them a little less lavishly.

**BARONIAL ANNIVERSARY** : No summary, to be presented next Council.

### **UPCOMING EVENTS**

**YULE** – Proposal, budget and sample hall-hire forms from Mýrún not yet reviewed by Financial Committee or others, not ready for Council decision. OK to 'noise it about a bit'.

For a brief update, the Dunedin library has advised its facilities are too small to accommodate us, leaving us with the Uni's collection to tour. I propose a rapier tourney to be held inside the hall (or outside if weather permits) as a substitute activity. Along with this there is a Brewing A&S competition.

For the feast and evening's entertainment - Yule Quill poetry competition. Some carols and dancing would be most welcome if someone from Christchurch is willing to organise. The event theme is officially Tudor.

**OCTOBER – BALL-** Plans are in the works for a ball to be organised by Isobel Maria.



**GENERAL BUSINESS:**

**HIRE GARB:** To be moved from Showbiz to Chatelaine's flat. Transport arranged, this Sunday 3pm – Angus, Agnes and Elena, Quentin.

**MEDICAL SUPPLIES USED AT CF:** Approx \$40, replacement quotes supplied by Glenn.

Raffe: Should these costs come from CF or Baronial Budget? Richard: Baronial, not CF. No dispute.

Raffe moved for supplies to be purchased as per Glenn's quote. Seconded by Isabel Maria. Motion passed.

Cost of materials for gambesons made by Christine Duvant, Richard and others – to come out of Baronial budget, not CF. No dispute.

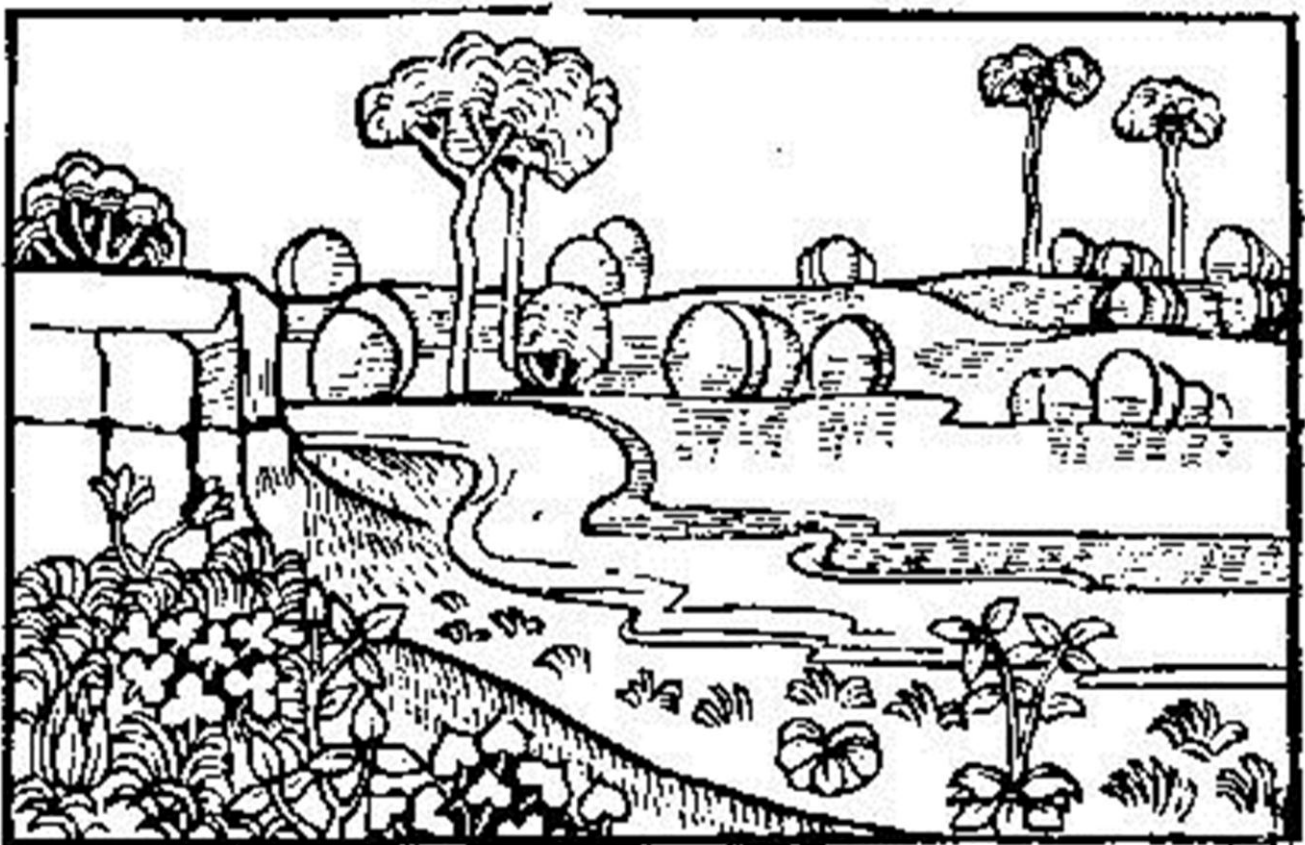
