Their Excellencies Speak

Greetings to the populace of Southron Gaard

This year has been very busy for us, both within the SCA and in Real Life TM (Carl has been starting out in his new career and Miriam is now studying towards hers). While it is an exciting time, it can also be tiring, and time is always short. Consequently, we have had to make decisions about our priorities (fight practice, work that extra shift the manager wants, or work on that essay?) and what we can realistically do (will that project fit around work/study commitments?) etc. Of course, these decisions are not at all unusual - they are something that people in the SCA do all the time based on their own priorities at any given moment.

It is often said that "real life comes first" but we have also observed that notion is very easily forgotten when hip-deep in a stressful situation or discussing a project to which you have committed a great deal of time and energy. It is easy to attribute a slow reply from a steward or officer to obtuseness, contrariness (or incompetence) when it may simply be that real life commitments such as job or family obligations were more pressing. Our officers and stewards and cooks and all the people who help out are volunteers. They all have real world commitments and the time they spend on the SCA is often time that could be spent on something else. If the SCA wishes to keep these people participating and making the SCA what it is, we all need to keep this in mind.

Recognise that what you see at events represents only a tiny fraction of the time and effort the stewards cook, tent hands, and fetchers and carriers have put into that event. For some events many days of work have gone into the preparations and then, on the day, none of them will get much of a break until the site is spotless and all the equipment has been cleaned and packed away ready for the next event. It can be wearisome, but it can also be made thoroughly rewarding by the appreciation shown by those who enjoy the food and admire the pageantry. All of it all gets done around work, study, families, chores and more.

So, please support the stewards, cooks and officers and take a moment to show them how much you appreciate their efforts and, equally importantly, remember to enjoy what they have created.

With that in mind, We are absolutely delighted to see three wonderful events scheduled on the calendar: l'Evento Italiano (later this month), Golden Flight (November) and Canterbury Faire (January). These look to be three very different events, and We are greatly looking forward to attending each one of them. We look forward to seeing many of you at these events.

Seneschal's Comments

Such interesting times we live in! The selective suspension of parts of representative democracy over the last year or so in the mundane lowlands of Southron Gaard has yet to play itself out, but the historically minded among us will see echoes from the past.

It was a known practice in the early Roman Republic for the Senate to appoint a dictator in times of crisis: someone given temporary wide-ranging powers to act with impunity to address the crisis, before stepping down when the crisis had passed. This is said to have worked well enough until the ascension of Julius Caesar and his successors.

In the times of our Known World, most of the societies we re-enact ran to the autocratic or oligarchic style of rule, and our ceremonial forms of royalty and pageantry mirror this.

However, the more mundane aspects of our Society's operation are informed by modern practices such as consultation, voting, and accountability. This reflects both mundane legal requirements and our cultural expectations. Hence, all the major groups making up Lochac have a monthly cycle of communal decision making based around some form of council meeting. The monthly thing is a compromise between keeping things moving quickly enough and not making excessive demands on the time of the volunteers who fill the various offices.

This monthly cycle matters when preparing an event bid. The bid is normally approved at a monthly council meeting, and this approval needs to be at least a couple of months before the event so that publicity and other planning can happen. For this to happen, the bid needs to be presented sufficiently before the council meeting so that it

can be previewed and checked for being ready to go up for approval.

In recent times, there has been a tendency for event bids to come for approval quite late, which has required some extra effort from those of us doing the reviewing. Given the unusual times we are in, and the increased difficulty in finding venues for events, we have made the extra effort, since we need more events to be happening. However, I would like to see more lead time so that there is less stress involved.

By the time you read this, there is likely to be an approved one-day event in late October, as well as Golden Flight in November, which is good, and Canterbury Fair in late January, of course.

There is a bit of space in the calendar to have a one-day event in December, but this should be approved at the October council meeting so the bid would need to be ready by mid-October at the latest. What I am saying is that you need more lead time than you might think, and you should plan for this if you are thinking of running an event. It is not even too early to be thinking about Baronial Anniversary for next year!

AUGUST MINUTES: Accepted.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria):

Correspondence with Kingdom Seneschal, Group Seneschal, Reeve, Council and Financial Committee officers re Crown Tourney bid, members of the populace who proposed/worked on a Crown Tourney bid re their bid and procedures related thereto, members of the populace regarding other proposed events, Seneschal and outgoing herald regarding announcing new officers, members of the public and populace regarding demo requests, Amalie regarding tallage for November Crown winners.

No events attended.

Working on text for scrolls for baronial awards, and have done some work on the Court webpage.

SENESCHAL (Lowrens): Correspondence with stewards, Financial Committee, B&B, Kingdom Seneschal about Crown Tourney bid, with steward and FC about Chateau Blois event, with KS about quarterly report, with KS and Mýrún about St Kessog website, with SCANZ committee about progress on child policy, with SCANZ committee about troublesome bookings list for stewards, with Crux Australis and KC about new Herald and

Constable officers, QM about crockery/cooking gear audit, several people about demo events.

Getting myself organised to keep track of "matters arising" from Council minutes. Expect me to be sending you a reminder soon if you have been tagged to do something.

Delivered quarterly report to KS reasonably on time despite distractions.

REEVE (Richard): Much correspondence regarding Crown Tourney 2014 event bid. Whilst the budget provided added up, it was not supported by sufficient information about the content of the event itself and therefore I could not validate the budget. Concerns discussed with finance committee and Stewards. Bid was withdrawn.

Regarding bid for event from Chateau Blois. Budget seemed reasonable for event plan. Bid to go to Council for final decision.

Regarding Bidvest account: Account was closed (not carried over from Raewards) between CF2011 and CF2012. Now looking to re-establish for CF2013. Previous account was in Raffé's business's name (Pamco) so they had a trading history for setting up the account. Question for Council is do we need/want an account, and if so, should it be COD (pay on pickup) so it's just about using the service and getting good prices, or on credit (paid by DD weekly/monthly). Seems that different divisions though have different rules (some accepted credit card others didn't, some required COD others didn't). There are also potentially issues with us using direct debits, and I would like to check this with SCANZ treasurer. Amy has already advised she is happy to cover CF2013 on her credit card.

Discussion: Agreed that buying through Bidvest is a good option to have, but depends on the terms of the account. Reeve to investigate further and report back.

HERALD (Lucia): Since confirmation of office, I've had correspondence from the webwright to complete the new officer information form and a member of the populace would like to begin work on a submission in a few weeks.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Isolde): Exchanged emails with individuals who may potentially run an A & S class at CF. Italian dress project continues with regular attendance by those creating a dress and others who are working on other projects. Assuming the approval of an Italian event at this council meeting, planning an A & S activity on mask making to take place for the October Italian event.

CHRONICLER (Mýrún): Correspondence with stewards of the following events: Golden Flight 3, upcoming Italian event and CF regarding event adverts; Seneschal, B&B, Kingdom Seneschal re St Kessog website; Finance committee and Stewards re Italian event; Sir Callum, B&B, Seneschal and Chatelaine regarding loaner armour. A busy mundane month - just keeping up is enough this

month. Making Mongol garb for myself and Lady Edith for Golden Flight.

WEBWRIGHT (Eleanora): After getting the CF pages up it's been a quiet month online. I have written a one-page welcome sheet for new officers which is a bit formulaic but hopefully will overcome the back and forward involved in getting new officers set up with their email, Regnum, Populace page etc. Sent these to new constable and herald.

The new 3 special email lists are now established and I'm seeing a bit of stuff come through the officers one.

Had a meeting with the seneschal about various things and as a result I am adding 'tags'(metadata) to the pages which indicate when they were last reviewed, when due for the next review and which officer is responsible for content (i.e. who I'm planning to bug to update content) but I have not yet had time to go through and do this on mass.

Stats: 402 unique visitors accounted for 1,449 pageviews over the last month (to the 14th). These were largely the homepage, Regnum, Populace and Canterbury Faire pages although there were quite a few (52) views of the siege engines page.

Thoughts: do we need a page for media and/or people interested in having us do a 'demo'? If so who would write/update such a thing? I know there has been talk on and off about having a demo deputy, at other times such matters have been undertaken by the chatelaine.

CHATELAINE (Quentin): Correspondence with Iuliana, who donated some nice male garb to the hire garb, with the Baron and Baroness, the Seneschal, and various event planners about upcoming events and potential demos: the two A&P shows and two demos, one on October 4th and one next year in February.

The donated garb needs a little finishing. I can no doubt handle that myself.

QUARTERMASTER (Angus): No report received.

CONSTABLE (Bjorn): No report received.

MARSHALL (Callum): No report received.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darayavaush): Correspondence with Melisande about helping with their proposed event, Seneschal about council business arising. No events this month. Have been absent from Practice due to work, but did have an IKAC where the Barony posted its first scores for the yeoman division (13-15 years of age). Getting volunteers for tourneys at Faire, and a helping Chateau Bois with their proposed upcoming event. Price checking over various different web based archery suppliers for the best cost of arrow making materials.

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Elena): No correspondence this month. No events this month. Have been absent from Practice due to injury. In discussion to try and improve attendance. Currently fighters do not seem to wish to attend unless Captain is present. This needs to change as Captain is not Camp Mother. Difficulty may also be related to Seasonal climate change. Also, looking at what format of Tournament will work best for Golden Flight 3. Likely need to review closer to the event to establish who will be wanting to participate. IF numbers too low, perhaps an introductory class or demonstration would be appropriate.

Still looking at Marshalling training. Tournament experience is needed, so inclusion of some kind in upcoming events will be politely requested if possible, both for the above reason and to try and encourage participation from populace again.

CHIRURGEON (Kotek): No report received.

EVENT BIDS:

OCTOBER ITALIAN EVENT: (Melisande): Melisande presented Chateau Bois event for 27 October. Discussion about pragmatics of how the crossbow competition would be run in limited space. Darayavaush has checked the site and

thinks it can be done safely. Bid accepted unanimously.

GOLDEN FLIGHT 2012: (Jujiradai and Lucia): 11 bookings, one payment. Event will include 2 sets of rapier action, and dancing. 500 glowsticks acquired at a good price. No special problems.

CANTURBURY FAIRE 2013: (Amalie and Taddea): 70-80 bookings so far. The schedule is now up on the website. Wine tasting event needs to be cleared with site manager. No special problems.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Darayavaush re volunteer work at Canterbury Show - clubs get paid for providing volunteers for warden type duties, 8 hour shift from 6:30am, Wed-Fri. Rate is \$14/hour. Discussion noted that the Barony is not exactly hard up, but a special interest group could do targeted fund raising, e.g. rapier, or look at a new list field. Lowrens to put a notice on the local list, and Darayavaush to coordinate volunteers.

Demo request from Rolleston Primary School for holiday activity for ages 6-12 on half a day on 4 October. Isabel Maria will do some basic dances (branles, etc) with another volunteer, not yet found. IM to put a request for assistance on the list.

Demo at Ellesmere Show on 13 October - Lowrens reported four volunteers so far, mostly crafts types, but more heavies may also be there. This is enough people to be worthwhile. Want to have the pavilion there, since rain seems traditional and not enjoyable.

Plastic bins for loaner garb - purchase is already approved in principle. Proposed to buy these bins at Shirley in conjunction with the cooking gear audit on 6 October.

A request from a young Dunedin man (non-member) to borrow armour as props for a movie was declined. Chatelaine to pass the decision back.
