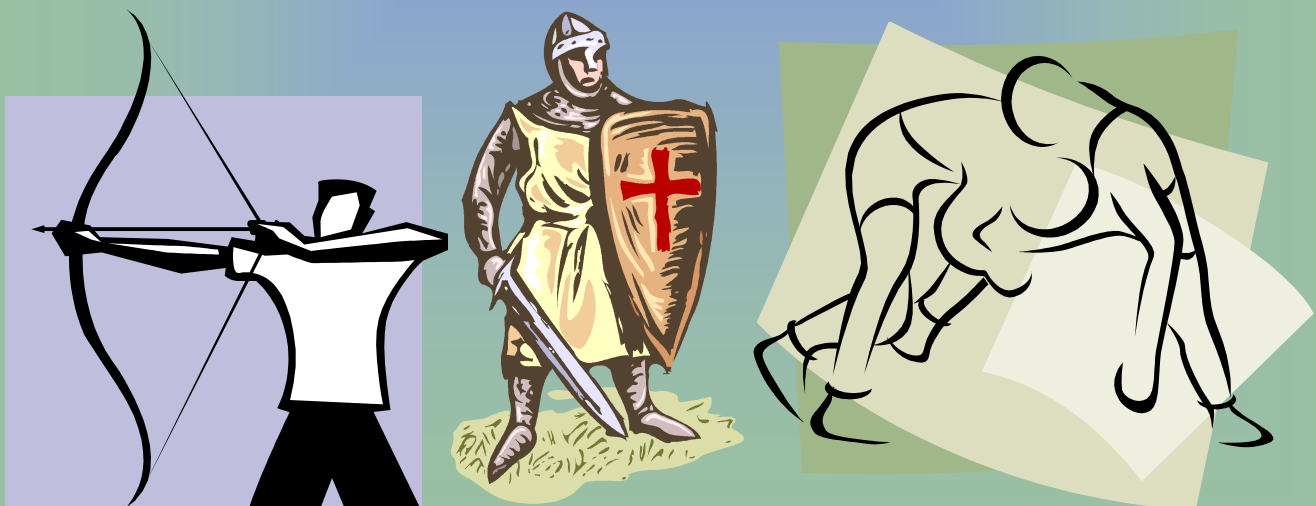

Wednesday 11th September 2013

MEETING OPENED: 7:30pm

PREVIOUS MINUTES: No discussion. Carried and accepted.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): A very quiet month.

Isabel Maria attended a meeting with University people regarding a demo later in the year. Both Isabel Maria and Oswyn attended the make-and do weekend organised by Sir Callum and held in his school's workshop. Oswyn attended a (rapier) teaching session run by THL Emrys on Saviolo. Correspondence with various members of the populace and with people in Ildhafn.

SENESCHAL (Lowrens): Correspondence with CF stewards re CF website and booking website, with Wei re insurance and legal things, with Briford Engineering about inspecting the trailer, with Kingdom Chronicler about Chronicler appointment, with Ellesmere A&P Show re demo, with Dunedin populace and B&B about Wildmore group application, with UCMRS about Steel Embassy at CF, with SCANZ committee re insurance.

Lodged the quarterly report. Used the word "quiet" several times. Emptied the trailer contents into the storage container, in preparation for having it looked at.

I got the September edition out on the second, a day late due to a not-so-lovely chest infection. Hoping the next few editions will be fuller in content.

WEBWRIGHT (Vacant): Currently vacant. One applicant received just before the meeting. The SG site needs some attention here and there. CF steward is doing the necessary for CF.

CHATELAINE (Quentin): Purchasing new garb bins. Moving existing bins out to the storage container. Keeping some on hand for Golden Flight.

QUARTERMASTER (Vacant): Office currently vacant. Seneschal reports that all the trailer contents are now also in the storage container in Belfast. Seneschal has the keys and the access card, so contact him if you need to get at anything. Looking to get the trailer checked over in detail. (In general business)

CONSTABLE (Bjorn): Quarterly report lodged with Kingdom Constable. Otherwise quiet.

MARSHALL (Callum): Correspondence with Dunedin populace. Attended archery and rapier practices.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darayavaush): Almost back with normal practices: one indoor session at Showbiz (thanks Raffe), and two sessions at Kirkwood. Have some more new people interested in archery, thanks to Jordan. Otherwise quiet.

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Elena): Not much to report.

Don Emrys was in SG recently and provided some Crimsafe mesh for fencing helms to several of our members. Practice seems to be running when the weather is fine.

I will be looking to book a weekend shortly to punch test clothing that is more than 2 years old (since its last test) as this has been specified as a must-do by the KRM. This can be done on an upcoming Sunday, preferably before our next Tourney.

CHIRURGEON (Kotek): No report received.

EVENT REPORTS:

Recent Events:

Demo at Ilam School by Callum, mostly a solo show and tell.

Upcoming Events:

Ellesmere A&P Show demo: Is on 19th October at Leeston. Two volunteers have come forward already; need at least two more to make it work.

Golden Flight: Quentin presented this event bid as lead steward (drop dead backup is Lady Chunegund). Event will run 10am Friday 15 to 4pm Sunday 17 November (Canterbury Show weekend) at Rimu Park. Archery themed with heavy and rapier tourneys, and wrestling. Most costs are per head except site hire and comps - requires 15 people on each day to cover these.

From history, this is quite reasonable. Bid accepted and approved by the meeting. Richard noted that we had not actually paid the site for the previous Golden Flight, since we haven't been invoiced. This may come out during set up for the event.

Chaucer Festival: Isabel Maria described this event, organised by the Free Theatre (??), and scheduled for evenings of 26th and 27th October. Similar in concept to Luxcity in 2012. Wanting to make this an annual event. SCA has been invited to take part. We can go low key, providing local colour. We could go higher key, providing a display of active crafts and activities - this requires more people being involved. General opinion was that this sounded interesting, but without the numbers we can't do it. Isabel Maria to canvas populace via SG Discuss to gauge interest.

CF2014 update: No update directly from stewards. Noted that the feast date has not yet been set. Bookings are open. Money is starting to come in. Richard is exploring making our Bidvest account usable by private groups for catering at CF. Requires that people using are organised, know what they want and have their money up front. No credit and no fuss for the organiser is the plan. Richard to advise further when details clearer.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Lowrens wants to get an engineering inspection of the trailer. Cost not more than \$100. As far as known, this has not been done since we bought it. Approved. Lowrens to arrange inspection.

Seneschal Wanted

As the successful candidate, you will be the chief administrative officer of the Barony and the principal mundane legal representative of SCANZ within the Barony, for two years from next March.

You need to have current SCA membership, and having regular access to email is essential, of course.

Your routine workload is organizing the monthly council meetings, getting the minutes to the mailing list and the newsletter, and making sure that important notices go out to the populace.

As well, there is consulting with the Baron and Baroness on the running of the Barony, and overseeing the general running of the mundane side of the Barony i.e., that offices are filled, that events are happening, that we are complying with mundane, SCA, and Kingdom law in our activities.

There is a good deal more detail to found in the Officer's Job Descriptions document at <http://sg.lochac.sca.org/docs/OfficerDescriptions.doc>, and you will almost certainly find yourself doing stuff that is not written in there, as well.

Other fringe benefits are: a nice staff of office with a tower on the end, a big brass key to wear on your belt when you remember to, and the chance to mix it with a bunch of people, here and elsewhere in the Kingdom, who really care about this thing that we do, and who give up their spare time to make it happen. What more could you ask?

Chatelaine Wanted

The Chatelaine is responsible for the encouragement and empowerment of newcomers in the group. This involves both actively chatting to interested people at musters and other public events, and fielding enquiries about the group from the Southron Gaard website, from which the Chatelaine's email is linked.

The Chatelaine is also responsible for the housing and administration of the Baronial Hire Garb, though this may be delegated to a deputy. This involves loaning hire garb to newcomers and encouraging them to acquire or make their own clothing.

Workload can be high immediately prior to an event, often with last-minute requests for hire garb. This can be managed by posting reminders about hire garb cut-off dates to the SG lists.

Requires a current SCA membership, a sunny disposition, a positive outlook about the group, and a willingness to chat to strangers.

The Chatelaine is a deputy to the Seneschal and reports to the Barony monthly at Council and/or via a written report. Quarterly reports are made to the Kingdom Hospitality Minister and cc-ed to the Seneschal and B&B.

Quartermaster Wanted

VACANCY - WE NEED A NEW QUARTERMASTER!!!!

Now that Lord Angus has served his term, and more, this office of the Barony stands empty.

The duties of the Quartermaster are:

- * To manage the storage and to keep track of Baronial equipment,
- * To ensure clean and secure storage of the Baronial equipment,
- * Communicate with event stewards/cooks regarding required equipment for events, and arrange pick up/drop off,
- * To maintain the Baronial Inventory, and check off returned equipment,
- * Report to Council regarding status of equipment, including loss, damage, replacement or new equipment required.

The quartermaster is a deputy to the Seneschal and reports to him/her as well as the Council.

The amount of Baronial gear is currently beyond the scope of most of us being able to provide our own storage space (about a single-car garage space). We currently are resigned to having to pay for commercial storage for a while until we find a new home for our stuff.

This is all by way of saying that you don't personally have to provide storage to be the QM - it's about keeping tabs on what we have and who needs it, and when.

Captain of Archers Wanted

The archery captain is responsible for coordinating and running archery events and activities within the Barony. This includes running weekly practices, encouraging and teaching newcomers to archery, creating and marshalling archery shoots for events, and assisting in the upkeep and construction of equipment. Note that this covers both target and combat archery activities. Baronial practices are weekly, and take up approximately 2 hours every Sunday afternoon. Regular attendance at baronial council meetings is required. For important events such as Canterbury Faire or Baronial Anniversary, the Captain will need to plan and create appropriate shoots, and be in charge of running them at the event. Periodic upkeep of Baronial equipment is required.

A current SCA membership is necessary. The Captain should be familiar with the relevant rules for SCA target and combat archery participants, and possess an eye for potential safety issues – a current Light Combat and/or Target Archery marshal authorization is desirable. He/she should have the capability to store and transport the equipment required to run practices and shoots at events. Reliable internet access is highly recommended, for maintaining contact with archery-related activities and events around the kingdom.

The archery captain is a deputy to the baronial marshal, and submits reports through them. The Kingdom deputy marshal for combat archery has also requested regular updates on activities – archer@lochac.sca.org
